Materials You'll Need:

- Crayons or colored pencils
- Blank paper
- Printed outlines of a few simple flags (e.g., Japan, Canada, France)
- A world map or globe (optional, but helpful!)
- Pictures or a book showing various world flags (optional)

Let's Explore Flags!

Hi Explorer! Have you ever seen a flag? Maybe at school, a park, or even on TV? Flags are super special pictures made of cloth that tell us about a place, usually a whole country! It's like a country's special symbol.

Every country has its very own flag, and they are all different! Some have stripes, some have stars, some have cool shapes or pictures. Isn't that neat?

Activity 1: Flag Detective

Let's look at some flags! (Show pictures or printed flags). Look at this one! This is the flag of Japan. What shape do you see in the middle? (A circle!) What color is it? (Red!) It's on a white background.

Now look at this one. This is the flag of Canada. What picture do you see? (A leaf!) It's a special leaf called a Maple Leaf. What colors do you see? (Red and white!)

Can you find these countries on our map or globe? (Optional)

Activity 2: Color Your Own Flag!

Now it's your turn to be a flag artist! Here are some outlines of flags. Let's try coloring them correctly.

- 1. Color the circle on the Japanese flag red.
- 2. Color the maple leaf on the Canadian flag red, leaving the sides white.
- 3. (Add another simple flag like France blue, white, red vertical stripes) Color the stripes on the French flag the right colors: blue, then white, then red.

Great job! You've colored flags from different countries!

Activity 3: Design Your Flag!

Imagine you could create a flag for your family, your room, or even a make-believe country! What would it look like? What colors would you use? What shapes or pictures would be on it? Use your blank paper and crayons to design your very own special flag!
